



CACREP Program Vital Statistics Outcomes Report 2023

The Master of Science in Counseling/Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MSC/CCMH) is in the process of seeking CACREP-accreditation. The data provided in this report outlines key graduate metrics to include the number of graduates, completion rates, licensure pass rates, and job placement rates over the past academic year. The data will be updated annually in compliance with CACREP accreditation requirements. This current reporting period reflects data from our academic year starting September 2022 and ending August 2023.

Number of Graduates

- There were 71 MSC/CCMH graduates for the reporting period.

Completion Rate of Graduates: 30%

- Of the 71 graduates of the program, 30% completed within 237 weeks (which is 150% of the expected completion timeline based on the length of the program).

Licensure Exam Passing Rates: 67% as reported by surveyed alumni

- State licensure exam requirements differ by state; however, all 50 states require at least one of the two exams offered through the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC). These include the National Counselor Exam (NCE) and the National Clinical Mental Health Counselor Exam (NCMHCE).

- Passing rates are collected in our annual alumni survey. Of the 71 students surveyed, 12 responded. This represents a 17% response rate. Of the 12 respondents, 8 reported having passed the exam.

Job Placement Rates: 75% as reported by surveyed alumni

- We collect graduate job placement data through our annual alumni survey. Of the 71 graduates in the report period, 12 completed the graduate survey, resulting in a 17% response rate. Of the 12 respondents, 9 reported being employed in a counseling setting as follows:
 - 4 employed full-time
 - 3 employed part-time
 - 2 employed as interns in state approved supervision
