### Credit Recommendation Guide

The New Mexico POST Academy training has been evaluated by the College of Criminal Justice and Security to potentially fulfill 30 required course of study credits in the BSCJA v 004 program unless specified otherwise in policy or limited by the state or jurisdiction of a student's residence.

The New Mexico POST Academy training has also been evaluated by the School of Business to potentially fulfill up to 18 lower-division Interdisciplinary credits within any Undergraduate Business program. To receive any credits recommended below, students will need to submit a PLA application, proof of completion for their respective New Mexico POST Academy training, and a course waiver
