

# MSC/CCMH Phoenix Campus Program Outcomes Report 2024

The Master of Science in Counseling/Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MSC/CCMH) at the Phoenix Campus is accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP). The data provided in this report outlines key graduate metrics to include the number of graduates, completion rates, licensure pass rates, and job placement rates over the past academic year. The data is updated annually in compliance with CACREP accreditation requirements. This data is updated annually in compliance with CACREP accreditation requirements.

## Reporting Period:

- The reporting period reflects data from our academic year, beginning September 1, 2023 and ending August 31, 2024.

## Number of Graduates: 19

- There were 19 MSC/CCMH graduates for the reporting period.

## Completion Rate of Graduates: 83%

- Consistent with IPEDS logic, the completion rate (83%) reflects the percentage of students in a cohort who began the program in FY2020 and completed the program within 150% of the Normal Time (237 weeks for the MSC/CCMH program), including students if they began the program during the cohort year and attended for at least 30 days.

## Job Placement & Exam Pass Rates

In accordance with CACREP policy, to calculate the job placement and exam pass rate, the University surveyed graduates within 180 days following graduation. Twenty-six (26) percent (5 out of 19) graduates responded to the survey.

### **Licensure Exam Passing Rate: 60%** *(as reported by surveyed alumni)*

- Passing rates are collected via our annual alumni survey. Of the 19 alumni surveyed, 5 responded. This represents a 26% response rate. Of the 5 alumni survey respondents, 3 reported earning a passing score on the necessary exam(s) to become eligible to practice as a professional counselor in their state, to determine the 60% passing rate.

### **Job Placement Rate: 40%** *(as reported by surveyed alumni)*

- We collect graduate job placement data via our annual alumni survey. Of the 19 alumni surveyed, 5 responded, resulting in a 26% response rate. Of the 5 respondents, 2 reported being employed in a counseling setting. All responses are as follows:
  - Employed full-time in a counseling setting: 2 (40%)
  - Not currently employed: 3 (60%)
